

Bucehaven Review Meeting

Forth Cruising Club, 7.30pm on 25 January 2017

A special meeting was held on the above date to make decisions based on the recommendations of the Options Appraisal Report for the Review of Brucehaven Harbour.

The Constitution calls for the requirement for the meetings decisions to be binding required a quorum of 25% of the membership to be present, this required the attendance of 24 members based on current membership.

Phil Whetton, Club Commodore welcomed members and explained the purpose of the meeting and stated that as 25 members attended the meeting the decisions made would be binding.

Keith McDevitt, Rear Commodore Piers & Mooring, who chaired the Brucehaven Review short term working group, confirmed as per the invite that there was an expectation that the members had pre read the Options Appraisal Paper. He confirmed that there would be no discussion on the review options as the purpose of the meeting was to vote to accept or reject the reports recommendations.

The following is a record of the decisions made by members.

1: Recommendation that the RC P&M should actively police that the correct length of mooring chains and strops were being applied in accordance with club instructions.

ACCEPTED

2: Recommendation that Fenders be deployed whilst manoeuvring within Brucehaven as a mandatory requirement. **REJECTED.**

3. Recommendation that members be encouraged to deploy fenders whilst manoeuvring within Brucehaven. **ACCEPTED.**

4: Recommendations in relation to the three options proposed to reduce the number of available moorings. **REJECTED.**

5: Recommendation that the existing policy of a maximum boat length of 27ft for boats moored within Brucehaven should be restated and implemented. **ACCEPTED.**

The RCP&M thanked members for their contributions and commented that whilst the main proposals had been rejected the exercise in assessing how additional space could be achieved within Brucehaven harbour had been worthwhile and would at least stand as a record that we had exercised thought on this issue.

The Commodore thanked the members for attending and acknowledged the time and effort put into delivering the report by the RCP&M and his group.
